STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to provide for the Fortnightly Payment of Wages by Corporations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Every manufacturing, mining, quar-

- 2 rying, mercantile, railroad, telegraph, telephone and
- 3 municipal corporation, and every incorporated ex-
- 4 press and water company shall pay fortnightly
- 5 each and every employe engaged in its business
- 6 the wages earned by such employe to within eight
- 7 days of the date of said payment; provided, how-
- 8 ever, that if at any time of payment any employe
- 9 shall be absent from his regular place of labor he

- 10 shall be entitled to said payment at any time there-11 after on demand.
 - SECT. 2. Any corporation violating any of the
 - 2 provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine
 - 3 not less than ten nor more than twenty-five dol-
 - 4 lars on each complaint under which it is convicted;
 - 5 provided complaint for such violation is made
 - 6 within thirty days from the date thereof.
 - SECT. 3. When a corporation against which a
 - 2 complaint is made under this act fails to appear
 - 3 after being duly served with process, its default
 - 4 shall be recorded, the allegations in the complaint
 - 5 taken to be true, and judgment rendered accord-
 - 6 ingly.
 - SECT. 4. When judgment is rendered upon any
 - 2 such complaint against a corporation, the court
 - 3 may issue a warrant of distress to compel the pay-
 - 4 ment of the penalty prescribed by law, togeth-
 - 5 er with costs and interest.
 - SECT. 5. This act shall take effect May 1, 1887.
