STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Livingston Cushing.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of thirty dollars, being the amount of a coupon due December 1st, A. D. 1868, on State bond numbered 1431 which coupon is believed to have been destroyed, to be paid to Livingston Cushing of Boston on his tendering to the State Treasurer a satisfactory bond, conditioned to repay said sum to the Treasurer, in case said coupon shall hereafter be presented for payment.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

It appears from the statement of Mr. Cushing that coupon No. 9 for \$30, due Dec. 1, 1868, on Bond No. 1431, dated June 1, 1864, of the value of \$1000, was cut from said bond and lost in December, 1868, it probably having been burned with waste paper.

The books in the State Treasurer's office show that the above described coupon has never been paid.
