STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT relating to Hawkers and Peddlers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section one of chapter forty-four of
- 2 the Revised Statutes is hereby amended so as to
- 3 read as follows:
 - 'Sect. 1. Whoever, except as hereinafter pro-
- 5 vided, travels from town to town or from place to
- 6 place in any town on foot or by any kind of land
- 7 or water conveyance, carrying or offering for sale
- 8 any goods, wares or merchandise whole or by sam-
- 9 ple forfeits not less than fifty nor more than two
- 10 hundred dollars and all property thus unlawfully
- 11 carried, but this provision does not apply to com-

- 12 mission merchants and commercial brokers selling
- 13 or offering to sell goods by sample or otherwise
- 14 entirely by wholesale nor to any person selling fish,
- 15 fruit or provisions.'
 - Sect. 2. Section two of said chapter is hereby
 - 2 amended so as to read as follows:
 - Sect. 2. The county commissioners may license
 - 4 for the purposes aforesaid any person who satisfies
 - 5 them that he sustains a good moral character and
 - 6 has been for five years a citizen of the United
 - 7 States; such licenses expire in one year from their
 - 8 date and are not transferable, and the licensee shall
 - 9 pay therefor if he is to sell or offer to sell by retail
- 10 fifty dollars, if by wholesale one hundred dollars,
- 11 but soldiers of the State disabled in the recent war
- 12 of the rebellion shall have their licenses free.'
