STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE.

AN ACT to straighten the dividing line between the towns of Cushing and Thomaston, and set off a part of Cushing and annex it to the town of Thomaston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. That the territory that was set off 2 from the town of Warren and annexed to the town

- 3 of Cushing, and then known as the Benjamin
- 4 Kelleran farm, by the act of the Commonwealth
- 5 of Massachusetts of June 20, 1807, is hereby set
- 6 off from the town of Cushing and annexed to the

7 town of Thomaston, and the division line between 8 said towns of Cushing and Thomaston is made a 9 straight line, by extending the town line which 10 divides the land of Levi Robinson and the George 11 Heyler lot at the westerly side of said Kelleran 12 farm, on the same course eastwardly to the said 13 Georges river, and all northerly of said line, here-14 tofore a part of said Cushing, is hereby annexed 15 to said town of Thomaston.

SECT. 11. This act shall take effect on approval.
