RESOLVE in aid of a Road from Black Brook  
Bridge to Richardson's Lake in County of Oxford.

---

*Resolved,* That there be and hereby is appropri-  
2 ated for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one  
3 the sum of two hundred dollars, and for the year  
4 eighteen hundred and ninety-two the sum of two  
5 hundred dollars to aid in building a road from Black  
6 Brook Bridge to Richardson's Lake, in county of  
7 Oxford, said money to be expended in town of  
8 Andover, North Surplus, under directions of the  
9 County Commissioners of said county.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The road from Black Brook Bridge in the town of Andover, to the south arm of Richardson Lake is one of the principal roads leading to the Rangeley Lakes, and over it is conveyed a large amount of freight and a large number of passengers.

About four miles of it is through the township of Andover North Surplus, which is a very poor township, and which in addition to this road has another road some four miles in length across it leading to Upton, upon which the few settlers residing in said township live.

And for the past ten years the settlers and land owners in said township have been obliged to pay a tax of two dollars per hundred dollars of valuation for the support of these roads.
