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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED  
AND NINETY-ONE.

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AN ACT additional to Chapter Ninety-four of the  
Private and Special Laws of 1887, incorporating  
the Belfast Water Company.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. The provisions of chapter ninety-  
2 four of the private and special laws of the State of  
3 Maine of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven are  
4 hereby extended so that the Belfast Water Company  
5 shall have and exercise the same rights, powers and  
6 franchises, and be subject to the same restrictions,  
7 liabilities and duties, within the town of Northport

8 as it has and exercises, or may have and exercise,  
9 or is or may be subject to, within the city of Bel-  
10 fast by virtue of said chapter ninety-seven.

SECT. 2. Said company is hereby authorized to  
2 extend its pipes to and into said town of Northport  
3 and to supply the said town and the inhabitants  
4 thereof and persons therein, with water for all  
5 domestic, sanitary and municipal purposes.

SECT. 3. Said company for all its said purposes  
2 may hold real and personal estate necessary and  
3 convenient therefor.

SECT. 4. Said company is hereby authorized to  
2 make contracts with the Northport Wesleyan Grove  
3 Camp Meeting Association or its trustees, and with  
4 other corporations, and with the inhabitants of or  
5 persons in said Northport for the purpose of sup-  
6 plying water as contemplated by the charter of said  
7 company.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
