STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Drew Plantation.

Resolved, That the sum fifteen hundred dollars be 2 and is hereby appropriated to aid in building a 3 bridge across the Mattawamkeag river at Drew 4 plantation, Penobscot county; provided, a like 5 amount be raised by said plantation and the county 6 of Aroostook for the same purpose, the same to be 7 drawn and expended by the county commissioners 8 of Penobscot and Aroostook counties.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

By a resolve passed in 1889 entitled "A-Resolve in favor of Drew Plantation," the sum of fifteen hundred dollars was appropriated to aid in building a bridge across the Mattawamkeag river in Drew plantation, the same to be drawn within two years. A warrant was drawn on the treasurer for the amount, but owing to a defect in the proceedings by the commissioners, the money was not drawn, and on Dec. 31, 1889, the warrant was cancelled. The resolve simply calls for the re-appropriation of the amount which belongs to the plantation. It is not a new appropriation, and involves no new expenditure of money.
