STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT for the protection of trout and land-locked salmon in Big Bear pond and Little Bear pond and their tributaries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. No person shall take, catch, kill, fish for, 2 or destroy any trout or land-locked salmon in Little Bear 3 pond or its tributaries in the town of Hartford in Oxford 4 county, or in Big Bear pond or its tributaries in said Hart-5 ford and in the town of Turner, in the county of Androscog-6 gin, for the period of six years.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions 2 of this act, shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten dollars for 3 the offence, and one dollar for each and every such fish so

4 taken, caught, killed or destroyed; to be recovered by
5 complaint before any trial justice in either of said counties,
6 one-half to the complainant, and one-half to the county
7 where proceedings are commenced.
