STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT for the protection of fish in Quimby Pond, Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to take, catch, kill, or

- 2 fish for, land-locked salmon, trout or other fish in Quimby
- 3 pond in the town of Rangeley and County of Franklin,
- 4 except in the ordinary mode of angling in open water with
- 5 a rod and artificial flies, between sun rise and sun set in
- 6 each day from the fifteenth day of May to the first day of
- 7 October in each year.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions

- 2 of this act shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars for the
- 3 offence and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish

- 4 so taken, to be recovered on complaint before a ny trial
- 5 justice in Franklin county.
