STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT for the protection of Trout and Land-locked Salmon in Little Rattlesnake pond and its tributaries in the town of Raymond in Cumberland county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. All persons are forbidden fishing for, or

- 2 taking in any manner, any trout or land-locked salmon
- 3 from Little Rattlesnake pond or any of its tributaries, in
- 4 the town of Raymond, County of Cumberland, for the
- 5 period of four years.

SECT. 2. Whoever violates the provisions of this act,

- 2 shall be liable to a penalty of five dollars for each and
- 3 every trout or land-locked salmon so taken, to be recovered
- 4 on complaint before any trial justice in said county, one-

- 5 half to the use of the complainant and one-half to the use
- 6 of the county.
