STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT for the better protection of Deer in the Counties of Cumberland, Lincoln, Waldo, and York.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Whoever, in any manner or at any time

- 2 within two years of the approval of this act, shall hunt,
- 3 chase, catch, kill or cestroy any deer within the counties
- 4 of Cumberland, Lincoln, Waldo or York forfeits forty
- 5 dollars for each deer so hunted, chased, killed or destroyed.
 - SECT. 2. All the provisions of chapter thirty of the
- 2 Revised Statutes relating to deer, not inconsistent with
- 3 this act are hereby made a part of this act.
 - SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
