## STATE OF MAINE.

## RESOLVE in favor of Frederick T. Stevens or his Legal Representatives.

Resolved, That the claims of Frederick T. Stevens or 2 his legal representatives for bounty claimed to be in the 3 lands of the State is hereby referred to the governor and 4 council with full power to hear and determine the same, 5 and if allowed the governor is hereby authorized to draw 6 his warrant for the amount due.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Frederick T. Stevens, of Winterport, Maine, enlisted in the United States Navy, March 28th, 1865, for two years, and was credited to the town of Winterport, that he was accepted and went to sea in the spring of 1866, in the Flag Ship Franklin, Admiral D. G. Faragut, and that he was lost in the China sea, in the year of 1869, in the U. S. War Ship Oneida which was sunk with all on board.

It is claimed that the bounty was left in the hands of the State for the benefit of his mother Mrs. Lidia Stevens.
