STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to prohibit the exhibiting of Bears.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Whoever shall go about from town to town

- 2 or from place to place in any town, exhibiting any bear,
- 3 shall be punished by fine not exceeding twenty dollars, or
- 4 by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days, and such bear,
- 5 after such notice to the owner thereof, as the court may
- 6 order, and a hearing thereon, may be declared forfeited,
- 7 and ordered to be killed.
- SECT. 2. This act shall not prevent the transportation
- 2 or exhibiting of bears in any authorized menagarie.

SECT. 3. Municipal and police courts and trial justices

- 2 in their respective counties, shall have jurisdiction of
- 3 offenses committed under this act.
