STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of fish from any of the streams of water emptying into the Great Embden Pond in Somerset County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. No person shall take, catch, kill or fish for

- 2 in any manner, any trout, land-locked salmon or other fish
- 3 in any of the streams of water emptying into the Great
- 4 Embden pond in Somerset county for a period of five years
- 5 from the first day of April, A. D. 1893.
 - SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provision of
- 2 this act shall pay a penalty of not less than five nor more
- 3 than ten dollars, and a further fine of one dollar for each

- 4 fish thus caught, taken or killed, to be recovered on com-
- 5 plaint before any trial justice in said County of Somerset,
- 6 one-half to the use of the complainant and the other half
- 7 to the use of said county.
