STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to protect trout in Marshall pond and its tributaries in the towns of Hebron, Oxford and Paris in Oxford County, for a period of three years.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. No person shall take, catch, kill, fish for
- 2 or destroy any trout in Marshall pond or its tributaries in
- 3 the towns of Hebron, Oxford and Paris in the county of
- 4 Oxford during the period of three years from the time
- 5 this act takes effect.
 - SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions
- 2 of this act shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten dollars for
- 3 the offence and one dollar for each and every such trout
- 4 so taken, caught, killed or destroyed, to be recovered by

- 5 complaint before any municipal court or trial justice in
- 6 said county, one-half to the complainant and one-half to
- 7 the county.
