STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to afford protection to the Reform School buildings by effecting insurance on same.

Resolved, That the trustees of the Reform School are

- 2 hereby authorized to protect the buildings of the school
- 3 against fire, by insurance, and the sum of eight hundred
- 4 dollars is hereby appropriated for that purpose.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Reform School buildings consist of main buildings, work shop, cottage, barns and other outbuildings, and altogether cost a large sum of money.

The trustees feel that the State ought to insure this large amount of property against loss by fire. The new cottage built in 1890 and 1891 at a cost of \$10,000 was burnt June 4, 1891; no insurance.

The cottage has since been rebuilt and is now ready for occupancy.

The trustees think they can get insurance at the rate of one and a half per cent for three years.
