STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE relating to certain school lots in Merrill Plantation.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the 2 sum of one hundred dollars to be used by the land agent 3 in setting off and locating certain school lots in Merrill 4 Plantation, said sum to be paid back to the state out of the 5 first money collected for stumpage from the lots so set off.

STATEMENT OF FACIS.

By the Public Laws of 1893 the land agent was authorized and directed to locate school lots in the organized plantation and township of the state and to record the same in the land office. There are certain reserved school lots in Merrill plantation, which have never been located for the reason that no money has been appropriated for that purpose. This resolve calls for a sum necessary to locate said school lots as contemplated by the Public Laws of 1893.
