STATE OF MAINE.

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.**

AN ACT to amend “An Act to incorporate the Brunswick
Village Corporation.”

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section three of chapter one hundred and
2 seventy-two of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen
3 hundred and eighty-seven, entitled “An Act to incorporate
4 the Brunswick Village Corporation,” as revised, re-enacted
5 and amended by chapter four hundred and forty-three of
6 the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and
7 ninety-three, entitled “An Act to amend ‘An Act to
8 incorporate the Brunswick Village Corporation’” is hereby
9 amended by inserting in the second line of said section
10 the word ‘legal’ before the word “voters,” so that said
11 section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Section 3. Said corporation at any legal meeting, and
13 by major vote of the legal voters present and voting, may
14 raise money for all purposes necessary to the enjoyments
15 of its rights and the performance of its duties, and may in
16 like manner authorize its assessors or its special committee
17 to contract in its behalf for any of the purposes aforesaid ;
18 but no vote of said corporation, for any purpose, shall be
19 valid, unless founded on a suitable article in the warrant
20 calling the meeting.’

SECT. 2. Section thirteen of said chapter one hundred
2 and seventy-two, is hereby amended by striking out all of
3 said section, and substituting therefor the following :

‘Section 13. Every person in the town of Brunswick,
5 qualified to vote for governor, senators and representatives,
6 residing within the limits of said corporation, shall be a
7 legal voter at any meeting of said village corporation.’

SECT. 3. This act to take effect when approved.
