### STATEMENT OF FACTS TO ACCOMPANY HOUSE DOCUMENT No. 243.

North Yarmouth Academy is one of the oldest academies in Maine, having been established in 1810 and incorporated in 1814.

The only assistance it has ever received from the State was a grant of one-half township of land more than seventy years ago. Its history as an institution of higher education is believed to be equal to that of any academy in the State, more than three hundred students having entered college from its classes. It is today supplying the needs of a large area unprovided with other means of advanced study. The towns of Falmouth, North Yarmouth, Pownal, New Gloucester and Harpswell have no high schools and send pupils to this academy which also has at the present time a number of scholars from other parts of the State.
