STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to regulate the Ice Fishing in Thompson pond, in
Oxford, Casco, Poland and Otisfield.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be lawful for two years from the time
2 this act takes effect for citizens of this State to fish for, take,
3 catch and kill togue, pickerel and cusk during the months
4 of February, March and April of each year, with not more
5 than five set lines for each family, when fishing through the
6 ice in the day time, and convey the same to their own homes
7 for consumption therein but not otherwise, in Thompson
8 pond, so called, situated in the towns of Oxford, Casco,
9 Poland and Otisfield, and section 5, of chapter 42, of the

10 Public Laws of 1899 is hereby modified to conform with this
11 act so far as it relates to Thompson pond.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to a fine of not exceeding thirty dollars
3 nor less than ten dollars and a further penalty of one dollar
4 for each fish taken, caught or killed in violation hereof.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
