RESOLVE in favor of Benjamin Smith of Appleton in the
County of Knox.

Resolved, that Benjamin Smith of Appleton in the
2 county of Knox be paid the sum of eight dollars (\$8.00) per
3 month, commencing January 1, 1901, instead of the sum
4 of six dollars per month which he now receives under
5 resolve approved March 2, 1889.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mr. Smith received a pension of six dollars per month during life for injuries received in the service of the State at the time the boundary line was settled. He is an old man, lame from his injuries, and always had been, being obliged to walk with two canes. He has no property and is now eighty-five years old and the six dollars is not sufficient for his support.
