IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT relative to the employment of Superintendents of  
Schools by cities and towns.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The school committee of each town or city in  
2 the state may, and after July first in the year nineteen hun-  
3 dred and three shall, employ at the expense of the town or  
4 city a superintendent of schools, who under the direction  
5 and control of the committee shall have the care and super-  
6 vision of the public schools; provided, that nothing herein  
7 contained shall be construed to dissolve existing unions for  
8 the employment of a superintendent, or to prevent towns  
9 from uniting for such employment under the provisions of

10 chapter two hundred and ninety-six of the Public Laws of  
11 eighteen hundred and ninety-seven.

Sect. 2. The school committees of towns having under  
2 their care and custody an aggregate of not less than twenty-  
3 five or more than fifty schools may, and after July first in  
4 the year nineteen hundred and three shall, form unions under  
5 the provisions of chapter two hundred and ninety-six of the  
6 Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven.

Sect. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the  
2 provisions of this act are hereby repealed.
