STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend “An Act to establish a municipal court
in the town of Waterville.”

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Chapter two hundred and twenty of the
2 Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty,
3 as amended by chapter three hundred and twenty-nine of
4 the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and
5 ninety-one, and by chapter four hundred and eighty-two
6 of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and
7 ninety-three, and by chapter twenty-nine of the Private
8 and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five,
9 and by chapter three hundred and twenty-five of the Pri-

10 vate and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-
11 seven, is hereby further amended by adding to the end of
12 section fourteen the following sentence, 'and except over
13 criminal offences arising outside of said city, for which
14 trial justices may hold their courts within said city of
15 Waterville,' so that said section as amended, shall read
16 as follows :

 'Sect. 14. Trial justices are hereby restricted from
18 exercising any jurisdiction in the city of Waterville over
19 any matter, or thing, civil or criminal, except such as are
20 within the jurisdiction of justices of the peace and of the
21 quorum, and except over criminal offences arising outside
22 of said city, for which trial justices commissioned for
23 Kennebec county may hold their courts within said city
24 of Waterville.'

 Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
