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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND ONE.

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AN ACT amending an act creating the Rumford Falls  
municipal court.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section three of chapter 43 of the Private  
2 and Special Laws of 1899 creating the Rumford Falls  
3 municipal court is hereby amended by changing the word  
4 “one” in the third line of said section to ‘two,’ also by  
5 changing the word “thirty” in the tenth line of said sec-  
6 tion to ‘fifty,’ also by adding to said section the following  
7 words ‘together with such other jurisdiction as is now or  
8 may hereafter be conferred by statute,’ so that said section  
9 as amended shall read as follows:

‘Said court shall have original jurisdiction concurrent  
11 with the supreme judicial court, in all civil actions wherein  
12 the debt or damages demanded does not exceed two hun-  
13 dred dollars, in which any defendant or person summoned  
14 as trustee shall reside, or have a place of business in said  
15 county of Oxford, or, if not an inhabitant of the state,  
16 shall be commorant in the county of Oxford; and said  
17 court shall have original jurisdiction, concurrent with the  
18 supreme judicial court and the Norway municipal court,  
19 over crimes, offenses and misdemeanors committed in said  
20 county of Oxford, which are, by law, punishable by fine  
21 not exceeding fifty dollars, and by imprisonment in the  
22 county jail not exceeding three months, or by sentence to  
23 the reform school or Maine Industrial school for girls,  
24 together with such other jurisdiction as is now or may  
25 hereafter be conferred by statute.’

Sect. 2. Section sixteen of said act is hereby repealed.
