STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Maine School for the Deaf.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated for
2 the Maine School for the Deaf the sum of seventeen thou-
3 sand five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and
4 seven, and the sum of seventeen thousand five hundred dol-
5 lars for the year nineteen hundred and eight.

And be it further resolved that there be and hereby is
7 appropriated for the Maine School for the Deaf the sum of
8 twenty thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and
9 seven for the purpose of building a three-story brick school-
10 house, in front of and adjoining the present schoolhouse, on
11 Spring street, in Portland, county of Cumberland.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The proposed building is designed to contain ten schoolrooms on the first and second floors, and a gymnasium on the third floor. The building now used for a schoolhouse is too small to supply classrooms and rooms for the industrial department in addition, according to the present arrangement. It is desired to devote the present schoolhouse entirely to the industrial department and to erect a new building for the necessary schoolrooms.
