STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and seventy-seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three, amending "An Act to establish a Municipal Court for the town of Brunswick."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section eight of chapter two hundred and 2 seventy-seven of the private and special laws of nineteen 3 hundred and three, is hereby amended so as to read as 4 follows:

'Sect. 8. The governor, by and with the consent of the 6 council, shall appoint a recorder of said court, who shall 7 reside in said Brunswick, and hold his office for the term 8 of four years. In case of the absence of the judge from 9 the court room, or when said judge shall be an interested

10 party, or when the office of judge shall be vacant, the
11 recorder shall have and exercise all the powers of the judge,
12 including the authority to sign original writs and processes.
13 He shall receive an annual salary of one hundred and fifty
14 dollars in full for all services, payable quarterly on the last
15 days of March, June, September and December, from the
16 treasury of Cumberland county.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
