RESOLVE, in favor of the Saint Elizabeth's Roman Catholic  
Orphan Asylum of Portland.

---

*Resolved,* That there be and is hereby appropriated the  
2 sum of five thousand dollars, to be paid to the Saint Eliza-  
3 beth's Roman Catholic Orphan Asylum of Portland for the  
4 use of said institution, two thousand five hundred dollars  
5 to be appropriated for the use of said institution for the year  
6 nineteen hundred and seven, and two thousand five hundred  
7 dollars to be appropriated for the use of said institution for  
8 the year nineteen hundred and eight.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This institution is in charge of the Sisters of Charity. It is managed by the Sisters, who practically give their services and are obliged to practice the most rigid economy to keep the institution open. On account of the increased expenditure the ordinary expenses of the institution are greatly increased, whereas the sources of revenue have remained stationary. The income of this institution is derived from contributions, donations from private individuals, excursions and collections made in the different Roman Catholic parishes of the city of Portland; by the parents, when able; by contributions from the people of the city of Portland and from such aid as the State from time to time grants. The number of inmates are increasing from time to time and the income should be larger to allow the institution to exist.
