## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section forty-four of Chapter forty-one of the Revised Statutes relating to the taking of smelts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Section forty-four of chapter forty-one of the 2 Revised Statutes, as amended by chapters twenty, thirty, and 3 ninety-one of the Public Laws of 1905, is hereby further 4 amended by striking out the words "first and the fifteenth 5 days of April" in the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth lines there-6 of and inserting in the place thereof the words 'first day of 7 April and the first day of May,' so that said section as

8 amended shall read as follows:

No smelts shall be taken or fished for in tidal 10 waters, except by hook and line, between the first days of II April and October, under a penalty of not less than ten, nor 12 more than thirty dollars for each offence, and a further 13 penalty of twenty cents for each smelt so taken, and all weirs 14 for the capture of smelts shall be open and so remain, and 15 all nets used in the smelt and tomcod fishery shall be taken 16 from the water on or before said first day of April, under 17 a penalty of not less than twenty, nor more than fifty dollars, 18 and a further fine of five dollars for each day that any such 19 weir or net remains in violation of law. But weirs with 20 catch pounds covered with nets, the meshes of which are 21 one inch square in the clear, or greater, are not subject to 22 this section. But no smelts caught in such weirs after the 23 first day of April, shall be sold or offered for sale in this 24 state, nor shall smelts caught in any manner between the 25 first day of April and the first day of October following be 26 offered for sale, sold or shipped from the state under a 27 penalty of twenty-five dollars for each offense; provided, 28 however, that dip nets may be used betwen the first day of 29 April and the first day of May, and all smelts caught by 30 dip nets between said days may be lawfully offered for sale 31 and sold in this state; provided, further, that this section 32 does not apply to smelts taken in the Androscoggin river 33 above the Merrymeeting bay bridge, or in Narraguagus bay 34 or river between the first days of October and November, 35 nor to smelts taken in the Penobscot river and its tributaries

36 between the first and thirtieth days of April, nor to smelts 37 taken in Casco bay between the fifteenth day of September 38 and the first day of October, nor to smelts taken in Franklin 39 bay between the first day of April and the first day of May, 40 nor to smelts taken in Little Kennebec bay, so called, or in '41 Narraguagus bay or river, in the county of Washington, 42 between the first day of April and the first day of May, nor 43 to smelts taken in West bay and West Bay stream, so called, 44 in the town of Gouldsboro, Hancock county, between the 45 first day of April and the first day of May, nor to smelts 46 taken in Passamaquoddy bay between the first day of Sep-47 tember and the first day of October.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
