## STATE OF MAINE.

---

RESOLVE to provide for the maintenance of the University of  
Maine.

---

*Resolved,* That there be and is hereby appropriated for the  
2 use of the University of Maine the sum of forty-five thou-  
3 sand dollars during the year 1907 and forty-five thousand  
4 dollars during the year 1908 of which sum forty thousand  
5 dollars shall be used for a central heating, lighting and power  
6 plant and fifty thousand dollars for an agricultural building,  
7 and the further sum of forty thousand dollars during the  
8 year 1907 and forty thousand dollars during the year 1908  
9 for the maintenance of the university.

In recognition of the power and duty of the state to deter-  
11 mine, within the limitations of the act of congress, approved  
12 July 2, 1862, what shall be the character of the education at

13 the University of Maine which it will aid with an appro-  
14 priation, and especially to determine whether it will so aid  
15 instruction in scientific and classical studies other than those  
16 related to agriculture and the mechanic arts, this appropria-  
17 tion is made on condition that after July 1, 1907, the uni-  
18 versity discontinue the duplication of the liberal arts courses  
19 of the other Maine colleges, and the conferring of the bach-  
20 elor of arts degree. But this condition is not intended to  
21 exclude from the curriculum of the university any courses  
22 that are now or may be hereafter necessary to the adequate  
23 cultivation of its special field of work.
