STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section eleven of chapter thirty-nine of the
Revised Statutes, relating to the sale of milk.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section eleven of chapter thirty-nine of the
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended so as to read as fol-
3 lows:

‘Sect. 2. All measures, cans or other vessels, used in the
5 sale of milk, shall be sealed by the sealer of weights and
6 measures, by wine measure, containing thirty-two ounces
7 to the quart, and all quart bottles containing less than
8 thirty-two ounces or more than thirty-two ounces and four
9 drams, all pint bottles containing less than sixteen ounces

10 or more than sixteen ounces and three drams, and all half
11 pint bottles containing less than eight ounces or more than
12 eight ounces and two drams, shall be condemned, all bot-
13 tles within the above limits shall be passed as containing
14 full measure, and all other measures, cans or other vessels
15 shall be marked by the sealer with figures indicating the
16 quantity which they hold; and whoever sells by any other
17 measure, can or vessel, forfeits twenty dollars for each of-
18 fense.'
