RESOLVE, in favor of the Bath City Hospital.

*Resolved,* That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum  
2 of two thousand dollars, to be paid to the Bath City Hospital  
3 for the use of said institution for the year nineteen hundred  
4 and nine and two thousand dollars for the use of said institu-  
5 tion for the year nineteen hundred and ten, and that there be  
6 and is hereby appropriated the further sum of fifteen hun-  
7 dred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and nine and fif-  
8 teen hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and ten  
9 for repairs and improvements.



### STATEMENT OF FACT.

The Bath City Hospital was incorporated in May, 1908, and the citizens of Bath and vicinity have rallied to its support so that a suitable building has been purchased and is now undergoing renovation. The present building consists of a very large dwelling house which is well adapted for hospital purposes. The work is being done under the advice of physicians here. A competent housekeeper has been engaged and installed, and the hospital is nearly ready for use. Its affairs are in the hands of a Board of Trustees and others officers.

Bath as a railroad and steamboat center of a large territory is an ideal location for a hospital and one has long been needed owing to the hazardous nature of the employment in the industrial establishments of this city and vicinity.
