Resolved: That there be and is hereby appropriated the 2 sum of five thousand (5000) dollars to be paid to the Holy 3 Innocents' Home of Portland, for the use of the said insti-4 tution; two thousand five hundred (2500) dollars to be appro-5 priated for the use of said institution for the year nineteen 6 hundred nine (1909) and two thousand five hundred (2500) 7 dollars to be appropriated for the use of said institution for 8 the year nineteen hundred ten (1910).
