STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT in relation to exceptions and appeal in criminal cases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty-seven of chapter one hundred 2 and thirty-five of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by 3 adding at the end thereof the following words:

'But in all other criminal cases amounting to a felony, where 5 like motion is filed and appeal taken to the law court the con-6 currence of a majority of the justices shall be necessary to 7 grant such motion and no sentence shall be imposed until af-8 ter final judgment.'
