STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Ashland.

Resolved: That the sum of fifty-four dollars and fourteen 2 cents be and is hereby appropriated for the purpose of reim-3 bursing the town of Ashland for money paid by said town to 4 the town of Crystal for the support of Malcolm Willett, a 5 state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Malcolm Willett, the pauper named herein, went from Sheridan Plantation to the town of Crystal in October, 1905, and remained there until May 1, 1906. The town of Crystal sent this claim to the state and payment was refused on the ground that the said Willett belonged in the town of Ashland and the latter town paid the same to the town of Crystal. Since then it has been ascertained that the said Malcoln Willett was a state pauper and the state has assumed the payment of bills on his account. In the meantime the appropriation for state paupers for the period covered by this bill, from Oct. 22, 1905, to May 1, 1906, had lapsed and the town of Ashland now asks the Legislature to reimburse it.
