## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Thorn Brook, in the towns of Abbot, Kingsbury and Blanchard, in the County of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or 2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Thorn brook, so called, 3 in the towns of Abbot, Kingsbury and Blanchard, Piscata-4 quis County, from its outlet into the south branch of the 5 Piscataquis river, known as Kingsbury stream, in Abbot, 6 to Decker Falls, in Kingsbury, a distance of about five miles, 7 including the dead water at the foot of Whetstone pond, 8 for a period of four years from the date of the passage of 9 this act.

- Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this 2 law shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in 3 the general law of the State for illegal fishing.
- Sect. 3. Municipal and police judges and trial justices 2 within their respective counties shall have original and con-3 current jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts 4 in all offenses arising under this act.
