IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section I of Chapter 38 of the private and special laws of 1907, relating to fishing in Songo river, so called, in the County of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section I of Chapter 38 of the private and 2 special laws of 1907 is hereby amended so as to read as 3 follows:

'Section I. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch 5 or kill any fish of any kind in that part of Sebago lake 6 known and called Songo river, from a point opposite of 7 what is now known as Oliver's camp, a place in said lake

8 known as the mouth of Songo river, to Songo lock, so 9 called, from September first of each year to May first of the 10 following year. Provided, however, that it shall be lawful 11 to dip smelts in the usual way.'
