IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the Maine Sportsmen's Fish and Game Association.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Strike out all of section one of chapter 532,

Whitman, together with their associates and 30 successors, all citizens of the State of Maine, be and hereby 31 are constituted a body corporate and politic by the name of 32 the Maine Sportsmen's Fish and Game Association, for the 33 purpose of assisting in the preservation of our fish, game 34 and forests, and preventing forest fires, and of preserving 35 our lakes and rivers, for the best interest of the State, and 36 for the enforcement of all laws relating to the same; secur-37 ing and publishing for the benefit of our citizens, valuable 38 information, to the end that additional and permanent pros-39 perity may result; to have and use a seal; to make and 40 enforce by-laws for the management of its financial and 41 other affairs, not inconsistent with the laws of the State.'

Sect. 2. Strike out all after the first five lines of said 2 section and insert the following:

"The annual meetings shall be held at such time and place
4 as the directors may determine, for the election of officers,
5 which shall be by ballot, and for the transaction of any
6 other business which may properly come before the meet7 ing; other meetings to be provided for in the by-laws,' so
8 that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. The first meeting of the association shall be held in Augusta, Maine, for organization, and may be called by in any five of the corporators, on written notice to all of the other corporators and associates, stating the time and place of meeting, five days at least before the day named there-in the for. The annual meetings shall be held at such time and place as the directors may determine, for the election of officers, which shall be by ballot, and for the transaction of any other business which may properly come before the meeting; other meetings to be provided for by the by-laws.'

To amend by adding the following additional section:

'Sect. II. It shall be the duty of the secretary, to secure 21 all the information possible, relating to the misuse of the 22 lakes and rivers; the pollution of its waters, whereby fish 23 may be injured, or the privileges of the citizens of the State, 24 rightly entitled to, may be interfered with or injured, and 25 present such information to a meeting of the association, 26 duly called to consider it.'

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
