STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Howland in Penobscot County.

Resolved, That the sum of three thousand dollars be and 2 hereby is appropriated and paid to the treasurer of the town 3 of Howland to reimburse said town in part for disburse-4 ments in repairing piers and bridges across the Piscataquis 5 river. The same to be paid from the treasury of the State 6 in two equal annual payments on the first day of July, 1909, 7 and the first day of July, 1910.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Howland has a population of 519. Valuation, \$280,000. Polls, 166; rate of taxation 22 mills, on a full valuation. The town has expended on this bridge \$6,221.68 in the year 1908; the indebtedness of the town is about \$12,000.00.
