IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to set off a lot of land from Bucksport and annex
same to the town of Dedham.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. To set off from the town of Bucksport and annex to the town of Dedham, a certain piece of land, a portion of which is occupied by the Brookside Cemetery.

Said parcel of land is bounded as follows: Beginning on the town line between Dedham and Bucksport at a point nearly opposite said cemetery, thence south 56" west 21 rods and 2 feet to a stake; thence north 31" west 6 rods and 8 5 feet to a stake; thence north 52" east 37 rods to said town line; thence south 16" east on said town line to place of beginning.
