IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Locke's brook, so-called, in the town of Hollis, York County, and tributaries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or 2 kill any kind of fish at any time, for a period of two years 3 from the time this act takes effect, in Locke's brook, so-4 called, or any of its tributaries, in the town of Hollis, County

- 4 called, or any of its tributaries, in the town of Hollis, County 5 of York.
- Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this 2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the 3 general law of the State for illegal fishing.
- Sect. 3. Municipal and police courts and trial justices in 2 their respective counties shall have upon complaint original

- 4 courts in all prosecutions arising under this act, and all fines,
- 5 forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this act
- 6 shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to
- 7 the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees
- 8 for the protection of birds and game.
