STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to prohibit expectoration in certain Public places and
Conveyances.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall expectorate or spit on any public sidewalk, or public street crossing, or cross walk, or, except in receptacles provided for the purpose, upon the floor in any city or town hall, in any court house or court room, in any factory, in any public library or museum, in any church or theatre, in any lecture or music hall, in any ferryboat or steamboat, in any railroad car, except a smoking car, in any street or interurban railway car, in any railroad or railway car, in any railroad or railway station, or waiting room or on any sidewalk or platform connected therewith.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars.
