RESOLVE in favor of the town of Weston, Aroostook County.

Resolved, That the sum of sixteen dollars and eighty-nine 2 cents be and is hereby appropriated to reimburse the town 3 of Weston for supplies furnished State paupers.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Danforth Me., Jan. 28, 1909.

Mr. D. M. Libby, Augusta, Me.

Dear Sir:—We have a family of State paupers here in Weston, a family of Indians named Dominic. (Perhaps you know of them, as they came here from Cary.) We have supplied them for two years and the State has paid the town, but in the bill for the quarter ending March I last the State did not allow the full amount. Do you think we can get it by bothering Mr. Libby at the present time?

There were two accounts, one for clothing, \$13.03, and one for groceries, \$45.73. The last named the State only allowed \$28.84, leaving a balance the town has paid and not received from the State of \$16.89. If you think we can get this please let me know how to proceed and oblige
