RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Marion.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum

- 2 of one hundred and twelve dollars to be paid to the town of
- 3 Marion to reimburse said town for money expended in sup-
- 4 port of William Maloney, a State pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

William Maloney applied to the Overseers of the Poor of the town of Marion for assistance in 1906. The municipal officers beliveing that he had a residence in New Brunswick, notified Immigrant Inspector Gillis of Calais, who took the said Maloney to St. John, N. B., but had to bring him back to Marion as he had no residence there. The town has supported him since his return. On account of the death of the Selectman and Overser of the Poor, B. L. Smith, the bills for support of said State pauper were not forwarded to the governor and council until February, 1908, consequently barred by chapter 113, P. L. 1907. This is to reimburse the town of Marion for money actually expended.
