*Resolved,* That the sum of fifty-three dollars and thirty-  
2 three cents be and is hereby appropriated to reimburse the  
3 town of Hodgdon for supplies furnished to State paupers.



## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Hodgdon, Feb. 8, 1909.

The following bills contracted in the month of December, 1907, were paid by the town of Hodgdon, but disallowed by the Auditor because of a misconstruction of the new State pauper law, in regard to the time that bills for the support of State paupers should be presented to the Governor and Council for payment:

On account of Sanford Grant for supplies furnished by F. H. Vail .....	\$9 30
On account of Sanford Grant for supplies furnished by John Mack .....	1 65
On account of Neal Suiter for supplies furnished by R. L. Perrigo .....	6 58
On account of Neal Suiter for medicine furnished by Dr. P. L. B. Ebbett .....	25
On account of Florence Churchill for board furnished by I. L. Hutchinson .....	12 00
On account of Neal A. Grant, for supplies furnished by C. F. Cunliffe .....	1 60
On account of Neal A. Grant for supplies furnished by F. H. Vail .....	9 95
On account of Emily Lowdon for board furnished by David Cassidy .....	12 00

Total amount .....	\$53 33

The original bills were presented to the Governor and Council about March 10th, 1908, being within the three months required by law, as we understand it.
