Resolved: That the sum of \$186.27 be appropriated to re-
2 imburse the town of Dexter for pauper supplies furnished
3 William A. Hunt.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mr. Hunt was born in Kingsbury Plantation, March 26, 1866. Lived there until 18 years old, then moved to Cambridge and lived there 3 or 4 years, then worked around in different towns a year or two in a town, never over two years in a place, until he went to Dexter in 1901 and stayed until 1903, when he went to Ripley and stayed 6 months, then back to Dexter, where he lived until March, 1906, then went to Garland, lived there 6 months, then to Charleston.

His family consists of a wife and three children. He is without property and has never gained settlement in any town. He and wife have had a great deal of sickness.
