#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Scholes Rostron first came to America when he was about 19 or 20 years of age and remained about one year. He again came in July, 1902, and remained until the spring of 1903.

While in Dexter, Me., he was sick most of the time and supported by charity, as he was without property of any kind. As he wished to return to England the town of Dexter furnished him passage money, and a few supplies, amounting in all to \$67.80.
