

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Dennysville.

Resolved, That there be paid to the town of Dennysville 2 out of any funds of the State not otherwise appropriated 3 the sum of one hundred and eight dollars and fifty-nine 4 cents (\$108.59) to reimburse said town for money paid out 5 for the benefit of Charles Farley, an inmate of the Perkins

6 Institute and Massachusetts School for the Blind.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Dennysville paid out for the benefit of Charles Farley, an inmate of the Perkins Institute and Massachusetts School for the Blind, the sum of one hundred and eight dollars and fifty-nine cents (\$108.59) which, under the law, should have been paid to the town, by the State. Itemized bills of these expenditures were presented to the governor and council and would have been paid excepting that the State appropriation for that purpose had been exhausted.
