Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dol-2 lars be appropriated to reimburse the town of Perham, in the 3 county of Aroostook for money expended by it during 1907 4 and 1908, for medical attendance furnished Stephen August,



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Stephen August was a former resident of Perham, and at the time of the shooting accident which necessitated the medical attendance for which this appropriation is asked, was living in said town. The accident occurred in the woods on wild lands adjoining Perham, and as Mr. August was a pauper the town assumed and paid the bill for medical attendance. The bill for same was received too late to be referred to the State Beneficiary Committee, therefor, the town asks to be reimbursed by the State by the accompanying resolve.
