IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Paragraph V of Section 4 of Chapter 109 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, relating to depositions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph V of Section 4 of Chapter 109
2 is hereby amended by adding to the said paragraph the
3 following words: 'or that he has become so infirm or sick

- 4 since the taking of the deposition as to be unable to attend
- 5 the place of trial,' so that said Paragraph V when amended
- 6 shall read as follows:

'V. When the deponent resides in a town other than that 8 in which the trial is to be held; also when he resides in the 9 same town; but in the latter case, the deposition shall not

10 be used, unless, at the trial, the party offering it shows the
11 deponent's death or permanent removal from that town, or
12 that he has become so infirm or sick since the taking of the
13 deposition as to be unable to attend the place of trial.'
