IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section five of chapter seventy-nine of the Revised Statutes, relating to the signing of writs and other papers by deputy clerks of court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section five of chapter seventy-nine of the 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding to said sec-3 tion the following words: 'And the signature of any duly 4 appointed and qualified deputy clerk of said court or the 5 courts mentioned in sections seventy-nine and eighty of this 6 chapter, followed by the designation "deputy clerk" shall 7 be a sufficient signature to any writ, precept, instrument 8 or process, in law or equity, issuing from said courts or 9 either of them.'
